Perception of the target population on the risk of disease

A variety of studies from e.g., Australia, China, Pakistan, Italy, and other countries in different target populations (medical personnel, girls, MSM, students, general public) show low to moderate knowledge and awareness of HPV related cancers, partly associated with vaccine uptake. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5
